"Every time I feel the Spirit" explores the powerful combination of Spirit and prayer as indicated in the key words of the refrain. African American scholar W.E.B. DuBois (1868–1963) ascribed three gifts from the African American community that "mingle" with the others who occupy the land now called the United States of America. The first is "the gift of story and song." The second is "the gift of sweat and brawn to beat back the wilderness, conquer the soil, and lay the foundations of this vast economic empire . . .". The third gift is "the gift of the Spirit" (DuBois, 1903, pp. 189–190). The following witness indicates that the Spirit imbued enslaved Africans with both joy and endurance:

In slavery times, my master whipped me terribly, especially when he knew I was praying. He was determined to whip the Spirit out of me, but he never could, for the more he whipped me, the more the Spirit made me happy to be whipped.

The refrain may find its biblical roots in the outpouring of the Spirit at Pentecost (Acts 2:1–4), or it could be an extension of Paul's understanding of the Spirit in Romans 8:26: "Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered" (KJV)

Returning to the initial assertion by W.E.B. DuBois concerning the "gift of the Spirit" from the African American community to all in the United States, the following slave narrative, while bearing a specific poignancy in its context, is a witness that might be told by many:

I felt awful when I first got to church and took my place in the stand, waiting for the congregation to gather. And the spirit lifted me up. I forgot all about the pain and just lost sight of the world and all the things of the world. When the spirit begins to work with me it don't have any cares for pain or anything of the world. . . . We rejoice because the spirit makes us feel so good and forget all worldly cares.
